

Collectors Watch Lots

Two watch icons are going under the Charterhouse hammer in their online auction of watches, silver and jewellery on **Thursday 4th February**.

Rolex and Omega are famous high end watch brands and have had a long time association with James Bond.

The earlier of the two watches at the Charterhouse auction is a 1960's stainless steel Omega Seamaster. It was found by the auctioneers in its leather box whilst clearing a Dorset cottage and is estimated at £2,000 - £3,000.

The Rolex Submariner is also a stainless steel watch but dates to circa 2000. Just like the Omega, it not only has its original box, but also its tags and outer boxes and is estimated at £4,000 - £6,000.
