Made by George Betjemann & Sons Ltd (who Sir John Betjeman, Poet Laureate, was the son of the Director) this inlaid mahogany cabinet folds up and out to reveal an interior fitted with cut glass jars and bottles. All the accessories are mounted in silver gilt and bear hallmarks for London 1921. It also has the advantage of being wired for electricity with detachable plug in lamps, with the gilt brass fittings and glass shade being all original.

Estimated at £8,000 - £10,000 it might be the ultimate Christmas presents for the lady of the house who has everything.
