The Edsel is perhaps one of Ford's best known models for all the wrong reasons. Named after the son of Henry Ford, founder of Ford Motor Company the Edsel was released with innovative features such as the rolling dome speedometer. However, sales were nowhere near as predicted and the production run was short lived. However, moving forward to 2015, they are now highly prized by collectors who pay huge sums of money to acquire this once unpopular car.

Featuring in the collection is a **1958 Edsel Citation convertible**, this top of the range car was one of only 930 manufactured. See picture below



This is followed by a 1959 Edsel Corsair, a fully restored, show-winning car. See image below.



With the last of the trio a **1960 Edsel Ranger**, the rarest of all Edsel convertibles, with only 76 being produced, believed to be one of only 20 surviving.
