

Triumph-ant Lots at Charterhouse

There are not one but two classic Triumph sports cars in the Charterhouse auction of classic cars at Sherborne Castle on **Sunday 17th July**.

“The market for British sports cars of the 1950’s and 1960’s remains very buoyant with bidders looking to re-live some of their youth or buying cars they looked at and could not afford when they were younger.” commented **Matthew Whitney**.

“However, rarely do you come across two such similar cars as the Triumph TR2 and the TR3a we have been instructed to sell and I suspect some bidders might find it difficult to decide which one they would like to take home!”

The first Triumph is a TR2 dating to 1954 in British Racing Green, is one of just over 8,600 TR2’s made between 1953 and 1955.

This is then followed by a 1960 TR3A in Old English White, which is one of over 74,800 TR3’s produced between 1955 and 1962.

Both TR's come to the Charterhouse classic and vintage car auction in fully restored condition and are estimated at £25,000- £27,000 each.

Elsewhere in the auction, which is being held in conjunction with the Sherborne Castle Classic and Supercar Show are a 1937 Rolls Royce Windover limousine £30,000-£35,000, a 1934 Plymouth Chrysler convertible, first registered to a lady in Bournemouth, £40,000-£45,000, a 1936 Morris £4,500-£5,500, a 1949 Daimler straight 8 limousine £10,000-£12,000, a 1957 Land Rover Series I £9,500-£10,500, a 1934 Armstrong Siddeley £7,500-£8,500 and a 1954 Ford Zephyr 6 convertible £22,000-£24,000 amongst many others.
