

Cameras Take a Pretty Picture

A collection of vintage and later cameras are estimated to sell for £10,000 when they go under the Charterhouse gavel in their specialist auction of cameras, photographs and photography related items on **Thursday 1st June**.

“Despite most people using the camera on their smart phones there is still a huge number of people who prefer a traditional camera with a film,” commented Richard Bromell.

The collection, from a deceased estate near Swanage, has been amassed over many years. The owner, a keen amateur photographer, had a particular interest in 35mm single lens reflex (SLR) cameras including Leica, Nikon, Olympus, Kodak, Pentax and Rollicflex.
